# How a law lecture lead to a world-first climate change lawsuit

Not only has she spent the past few weeks wrapping her head around fifth-year Law subjects, but La Trobe law student, Katta O'Donnell, has also been fielding calls from reporters at the New York Times, ABC, Financial Times and The Guardian, all of whom are clamouring for an interview with the 23-year-old La Trobe student.


