

Orthoptists are allied health practitioners who specialise in the detection, diagnosis and treatment of eye disease. Our orthoptics degree will enable students to begin a rewarding career in a specialist eye care setting. Students develop the knowledge and skills for advance treatment of children and adults with vision problems.

Students explore the anatomy and physiology of the eye to understand vision and visual function, and learn how to help people with eye disorders, eye diseases and low vision. In our training laboratories students learn how to use specialised technology such as retinal cameras and ultrasonography instruments with optical vision aids.

Clinical experiences begin from the second year of the program, with placements in hospitals with dedicated eye clinics, private eye clinics, low vision rehabilitation organisations and our on-campus eye clinic. The hands-on experience students receive helps to develop essential clinical competencies before graduation. Additionally there are local and international opportunities to further develop clinical expertise through programs with our partners

La Trobe is the oldest and largest podiatry school in Australia. We currently train over one-third of Australia's podiatry students. Our course is designed with our students in mind by partnering with a range of professional organisations for accreditation and registration. Graduates may be eligible to work overseas in countries like the United Kingdom, Singapore, Canada and New Zealand, subject to each country's registration requirements.

Students explore topics such as human anatomy, physiology, medical conditions, pharmacology, paediatrics, biomechanics, and sport injuries and management. Our labs are equipped with the latest technology including specialised podiatry equipment such as gait analysis systems, 3D laser scanners to manufacture foot orthoses and doppler ultrasound to assess blood flow.

The course prepares students to be graduate ready through the development of strong clinical practice skills. Students benefit from placements in hospitals, specialist clinics and private practices around Australia, with optional overseas placements. Students also design, manufacture and modify foot orthoses, and treat real patients at our on-campus clinic.


